

### Need and want to

- We use need + noun to talk about things.
- For example:
  - I need a new T-shirt.

- We use want to + verb to talk about actions.
- For example:

I want to go shopping.

I want to go shopping because I need a new T-shirt.



# Look at the images. What do John and Jane want to do? What do they need?







## Would like (to)

We use "would like + noun" to ask for something politely.
We use "would like to + verb to say we want to do something politely.

#### For example:

I would like a cup of coffee.

I would like to buy some bread.

#### Question form:

Would you like a cup of coffee?



#### Customer

• Hello.

• I would like a cup of tea.

- A sandwich, please.
- Thank you. How much is it?
- Here you are.
- Goodbye!



Hello. How can I help you?

- Alright. Anything else?
- Here you are.
- It's 5 dollars.
- Thank you. Goodbye!
